Shelter Build Update

The Humane Society of Mason County is getting closer to our much needed shelter in Mason County, Almost Home!

Located in Belfair on E North Mason School Road, we are pleased to share that in May 2017, our Group B well was installed on our property by Nicholson Well & Drilling. As it is a county requirement to also have a water satellite management contract in place for public Group B wells, we have also hired NW Water Systems to monitor our water analysis when we are up and running as a full shelter in the future.

All that remains is the approval of the Mason County Health Department which (fingers crossed!) we expect any day.

Next up, septic system! And thanks to the generous donations received during our Sails 'n Tails Auction's Fund a Need in May, we raised enough funds to install

our septic system. The septic design was completed in 2015 by Tom Weaver of Allied Design, and we are acquiring bids from contractors to install our septic

system. We are anxiously awaiting the estimates to come in from these Mason County approved contractors and expect to have these estimates by the end of November.

In addition to the septic install, we would also like to have the land cleared of all the stumps and weeds, the temporary power lines installed, and the back boundary lines found and properly identified. We have asked that all three pending contractors bid specifically on these tasks as well as we are moving forward to use our beautiful land for future HSMC events, including another Pet Fair in 2018.

Almost Home Foster Cats & Kittens

Earlier this year, HSMC began the Almost Home Foster Program for lost, abandoned and unwanted cats and kittens.

This program is run by one of our wonderful board members who volunteers her time (and her home!) to bring cats and kittens of all ages into her home for loving care until they are old enough, and in many cases, healthy enough to go to their forever home. All are also spayed/neutered and given their shots and deworming.

This program is supported by donations and veterinary care costs are covered through our emergency vet fund (also donation supported). And through the generosity and kindness of some local vets, we have been able to help any sick cats and kittens in need at a reduced cost.

Since the program's start, 23 cats and kittens have been adopted! And we have many more looking for their forever home, so please check out our

Many of our cuddly kitties are also featured on Petfinder, and we have been fortunate to also partner with PetSmart in Lakewood. PetSmart has also kindly donated food to help us keep these feisty felines from going hungry, thank you PetSmart!

Spay & Neuter Program

Since July, the Humane Society of Mason County's Spay and Neuter program has helped to spay/neuter 65 pets in Mason County!

This program provides low, and, in some circumstances, no cost spay and neuter for the pets of Mason County residents who cannot afford this service on their own.

Our program is funded by

donations and fundraising events, such as the annual rummage sale held each August in LakeLand Village and our Fix A Friend at our annual Sails 'n Tails auction in May.

Many of the pets are taken to Northwest Spay & Neuter Center in Tacoma whose monthly van pickups in Port Orchard and Shelton and low cost services proves to be very

convenient.

We also partner with Kitsap Humane Society and Dr. Olsen of Shelton who both accept our vouchers and aid in the spay and neuter of our county's pets.

TNR & Barn Cat Program

Did you know HSMC has a TNR Program? Trap-neuter-return (TNR) is a program through which free-roaming cats (not belonging to a known family) are humanely trapped, sterilized and medically treated to avoid unwanted litters. They are then returned to the outdoor locations where they were found. If those locations are deemed unsafe or otherwise inap-

propriate, feral cats can also be relocated to farmyard homes, also known as a Barn Cat Program.

HSMC's TNR Program has been responsible for the successful trap and return of 24 cats and kittens since October 2016. We work in partnership with Northwest Spay & Neuter Center in Tacoma to sterilize and treat, if needed.

We have a limited number of traps available to loan if you or someone you know has a feral cat in need of trapping. You can tell if your local feral has already been sterilized if their ear is clipped.

Contact our office Monday through Friday from 9am to 1pm if you need assistance to trap a feral cat or would like a Barn Cat to care for and help keep the mice away!

Fugs' Facts

Did you know cats can get pregnant as young as four months old?! A cat's pregnancy lasts about 63-65 days, meaning a cat can have kittens as young as six months old, when she's still a kitten herself!

Female cats can then keep going into heat every two to three weeks from the spring through early fall, so they are more often ready to

reproduce than not! That's why it's so important to get your cat spayed before she has a chance to go in heat.

Talk to HSMC or your local vet for more advice on spaying and neutering your pets to prevent unwanted pregnancies.

The HSMC office volunteers receive many calls each day about lost and found pets. Reuniting families with their lost fur babies is one of the many rewarding things they do for our community.

Recently, our Tuesday office volunteer received a call from a local vet after a couple dropped off what appeared to be a well cared for dog that they found on a busy road. The clinic had no place to house the poor pooch and asked HSMC for help.

As we do not have a shelter (yet!), one of our volunteers offered to take the gentle boy home and retrieved him from the clinic.

After getting him comfortable at her home, the volunteer took pictures and posted him on Facebook hoping the post sharing that Facebook pro-

vides could help spread the word and find this dog’s missing family.

It didn’t take long for social media to work its magic, and our volunteer was contacted by a woman later that evening ecstatic that she had found her pooch!

this boy who turned out to be 14 years old, blind and deaf. And he had been a part of their family since he was a puppy.

A series of bad luck events had caused the dog to wander away from the usual security of his own backyard, and as mom was searching for her boy, the kind couple spotted him on a busy and dangerous road and took him to safety.

Without the care and compassion of the local clinic, our volunteers and good Samaritans who spotted the dog, this story may have had a bad ending, but thankfully this ‘wags’ to riches story ended happy for everyone! It is also a good reminder to us all to always keep identification on our pets, and if not already, have your pet microchipped.
